

Is Stephen Hopkins "Stephano" in Shakespeare's "The Tempest"?

The Society of Mayflower Descendants in the District of Columbia recently held its May 2022 Membership Meeting. The event was a Spring Tea, for members, prospective members and guests at the Army and Navy Club in Washington, DC.

Our Guest Speaker, Andrew Giles Buckley, was introduced by Governor Ann Campbell. Andrew is the two-time Emmy Nominated creator of Hit and Run History, launched in 2008. He brings history to new audiences using advances in non-linear editing, mobile applications and draws inspiration from food and travel shows. Less Ken Burns and more Anthony Bourdain, Hit and Run History debuted on WGBH's History site in 2011. Awarded two grants from the Massachusetts Foundation for the Humanities and over 70

Massachusetts Cultural Council Grants from communities across the Commonwealth, Andrew is a world-class storyteller and an 11th generation Mayflower Descendant of Stephen Hopkins. Andrew's talk kept the audience spellbound. He was clearly knowledgeable and passionate about sharing what he has learned



about Stephen Hopkins and making it accessible to people of all ages. His talk was also illustrated by a number of video clips which demonstrated key points. At the conclusion of his talk, he took numerous questions from the audience.

Andrew's documentary, <u>Stephano: The True Story of Shakespeare's Shipwreck</u>, about Stephen Hopkins, provides interesting details and context. It also explains why some historians believe Shakespeare's The Tempest was influenced by Hopkins' Sea Venture experiences. The documentary is one hour and thirty minutes in length. She provides me with periodic updates so that we do not lose touch with our Life Members.

The quarterly publication of this newsletter, called "Pilgrim News" continues with Board Member Suzy Mulligan leading this project as editor. We plan to publish our 2021-2022 Member Directory later this year. Copies will be mailed to those who request a printed copy. Thanks to Membership Secretary Suzy Mulligan for her good work in making this a reality.

PILGRIM TRIVIA

One passenger we rarely hear about when talking about the Mayflower is her Master or Captain, Christopher Jones. He was born c.1570 in Harwich Essex, England and was quarter owner of the Mayflower. Jones was an experienced mariner who was contracted by Thomas Weston to sail the Mayflower with 102 religious separatists aboard to the New World, to land somewhere between Jamestown and the Hudson River Valley. Clearly Jones missed the mark on this journey, instead landing near Provincetown, MA in late fall of 1620. Illnesses of his crew and passengers delayed his return to England until April 1621 where he continued his career as a mariner, trading and transporting goods between England and France. He died in 1622, and in 1624 the good ship Mayflower was sold for scrap and dismantled.
