Looking Back: Milestones for Mayflower Descendants

All members of the General Society of Mayflower Descendants recently observed a major milestone as 2020 ushered in the 400th Anniversary of the good ship *Mayflower*'s arrival in Plymouth Harbor. While commemorative events

were disrupted by the pandemic, the importance of this milestone endures in the history of our country, the General Society and its member Societies.

As our own member Society, the Society of Mayflower Descendants in the District of Columbia, approaches it 125th Anniversary in 2023, we have been motivated to take a look back at more of our organization's past milestones, discovered in the pages of our historical documents.

The Society of Mayflower Descendants in the District of Columbia was granted a charter by the General Society on March 22, 1898. Mr. William Lowrey Marsh is recognized as the founder and served as the first governor from 1898-1901. Mr. Marsh along with twenty-one charter members organized and established the society, which was perfected on April 28 1898. The first Register or

DEPUTY GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE

On February 28th we held our first virtual membership meeting of 2021. The meeting was well attended with 41 members and guests. Our speaker, Louise Walsh Throop, gave an engaging presentation about two lesser known facts about the *Mayflower* passengers.

First, unknown to the passengers in 1620, the paternity of Richard More's young children was in question. The children's true father was likely a man with whom More's wife Mary had a previous relationship. Although known to us today, knowledge of the children's parentage was a well kept secret at the time.

Ms. Throop also discussed the secret identity of William Brewster. Before leaving on the *Mayflower*, Brewster and his associates Edward Winslow and George Soule evaded capture by local authorities for printing illegal books critical of King James I. Brewster escaped discovery by using the name "William Williamson." To shield Brewster and his associates from capture after the voyage, the names of the signers of the Mayflower Compact were not intentionally made public until 1669.



SURGEON'S REPORT

From Governor Ann Campbell

Since our Surgeon position is vacant, I am filling in with an update on some information related to the current COVID-19 pandemic. I am not currently a medical professional. However, I have almost 30 years of experience as a volunteer Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) in Virginia and Germany. I also served in the U.S. Army Medical Service Corps.

I currently live in Fairfax County, Virginia where I am a member of the Medical Reserve Corps, under the jurisdiction of the Fairfax County Health Department. Many other U.S. states and jurisdictions also have a Medical Reserve Corps.

Virginia uses a web-based information system, the Virginia Volunteer Health System (VVHS). The system serves as an alerting and credentialing system for local Medical Reserve Corps Coordinators and health districts. They use the system to manage medical and support volunteers who desire to support public health emergencies and daily public health activities, including COVID-19 Virginia-based vaccination events.

COVID 19 VACCINATION PHASES RELEASED BY CDC.

As we begin a new year with COVID -19 still having a tremendous impact on all of our lives, there may be some light at the end of the tunnel but it will be coming in Phases, not all at once.



As of December 2020 the CDC has pub-

lished the COVID vaccine phased roll out plan for the populations that will receive the vaccination and in what order.

Following is a snapshot of their phased plan.

Phase 1a:

Health Care Personnel, Long Term Care Facility Residents

Phase 1b:

Front Line Essential Workers, Persons ages 75 years and above

Phase 1c:

Persons aged 65 to 75 years and persons aged 16 to 64 with high risk medical conditions.

Essential workers not recommended for vaccination in Phase 1b.

Phase 2: All persons 16 year and older not previously recommended for vaccination.

ANN M. CAMPBELL- GOVENOR 2021-2024

Ann was born in Oakland, California. She graduated from **Ridgefield High School** (Ridgefield, Connecticut) and spent her Sophomore year of high school in Versailles, France. She earned an undergraduate degree in mathematics from San Francisco State University (San Francisco, California).

Upon graduation, Ann's first job was as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Jamaica, where she taught Modern Math to teachers. When Ann returned to San Francisco, she worked for the Bank of America, while she pursued her next degree, an MBA from San Francisco State University with an emphasis in Management Science. Ann worked for the U.S. Army in San Francisco and Virginia, in both a civilian and military capacity, over a period of 40 years. During that time, she earned two more Master's Degrees, one in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College (Newport, Rhode Island) and one in Peace **Operations from George Mason** University (Arlington, Virginia). 12

Ann retired as a Colonel from the U.S. Army. Although currently retired, she contributes her time to a number of organizations. Ann originally joined the Virginia Mayflower Society, but transferred to the DC Mayflower Society. She previously served as the Deputy Governor in the DC Society.

Ann is an avid traveler and has visited all the continents, including Antarctica. She has lived outside the U.S in Argentina, France, and Germany. She speaks Spanish, French, and German and also studied Latin.

Ann is a Life Member of the National Ski Patrol, the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution (Washington, DC), New England Historic Genealogical Society (Boston, Massachusetts), the New York Genealogical and **Biographical Society (New** York, New York), the Ridgefield Historical Society (Ridgefield, Connecticut) and the Chester Historical Society (Chester, Massachusetts).

KENT C. BOESE TREASURER

A native of Illinois, Kent attended the University of Illinois, as an undergraduate, earning a degree in Interior Design. I have been an attorney for 40 years in both government and private practice, specializing in bank regulation. I now am in semi-retirement as an independent consultant.

Some readers may remember me as a past Governor. That experience is very helpful in my new role as Counselor as I had first-hand experience in overseeing the interrelationship of the Secretary, Historian, and Treasurer functions. My duties tend to be more limited than those line roles, however, especially in terms of day to day activity.

I am expected to review the Society's contracts for legal sufficiency. I am responsible for the periodic review of our Constitution and Bylaws. I also respond to legal questions that the Governor brings to me.

Finally, the Counselor serves on the Finance Committee, so I participate in considering questions relating to our budget and financial condition

In 1920, our fellow members published again. Interesting to note that this was two years after the Spanish Flu pandemic with no mention of it being found. This yearbook was published January 1st, 1920, and was 58 pages in size. In this publication we find a bit more interesting information along with the standard list of General and State Governors, and Officers, Constitution and By Laws, and Members. A list of passengers, both with proven and unproven descendants was included, as was The Mayflower Compact with the list of signers. The membership grew substantially from 1898-1920, following is an excerpt discussing that growth:

"It was not anticipated that the Society would exceed fifty members, at least for several years, and its rapid growth has therefore been a most gratifying surprise. From 1898 to 1920 the membership has increased from twenty-two to three hundred and fifty -four. The location of the Society at the capital city of the nation has been an important factor in its constant growth and has enabled it to reach persons in the South who are eligible to membership but have no state societies of their own. Those who have thus proven their eligibility are among the most enthusiastic members. The Society has taken high rank among the State Societies for effective work in advancing the objects of the entire organization."

Not only was the organization interested in adding new members, there was a keen interest in growing a Library Collection as well. As Historian since the beginning of the society, Mr. A.A. Aspinwall was allotted \$50 annually to use to build the collection. As of 1920 he had accumulated 324 volumes, 27 pamphlets, which represented Town and Local histories, Vital Records and Family Genealogies. Our society still has a collection of at least 200 books, pamphlets and membership records, while over the years portions of the collection have been donated to the National DAR Society Library.

Of keen interest in the 1920 publication, especially to those who are descendants of Elder Brewster, is information about the Gavel:



"The gavel used by the Governor was made from a piece of oak, which was once part of the Manor House occupied by Elder Brewster. The wood was obtained by Mr. William Wallace Case, a Charter member of the Society, while on a visit to Scrooby in 1899, and by him presented to the Society".

In 1970 the Mayflower Society celebrated another milestone anniversary of 350 years! And our Society, in commemoration of the 350th Anniversary of the Landing of the Pilgrims in Plymouth, published what they called a Register, rather than a yearbook. This publication is 596 pages in length, and contains a wealth of information, and articles written by members.

Among the many interesting tidbits of information found within was about the Commemorative Seal on the front of the Register, which was drawn by Past Governor Lorenzo S. Winslow; "*the picture of the "Mayflower" was taken from the new original oil painting by Robert Paul Brackett and the model of the Mayflower is by our Treasurer Cdr. J.H. Bronson Smith.*" Being purely speculative, this author wonders if this oil painting could be one and the same as the Mayflower painting in possession of the Mayflower Hotel, as there was a time when the Society of Mayflower Descendants in the District of Columbia made the Mayflower Hotel their headquarters.

Among the several articles written by members, some titles are *"The Mayflower-Her Officers and Crew"* by Mrs. Anthony F.G. Lucas, *The Three Homes of the Pilgrims- England, Holland and America* written by the Honorable Maurice Thatcher, who also penned *The Pilgrim Pledge*. For the descendants of William and Mary Wentworth Brewster, there is an article of interest titled *"The Royal Ancestry of Mary Wentworth"* by Howard B. Burgess.

It was from the research efforts of Governor General Lewis Edwin Neff who compiled the generational history of Mary's family, beginning with Alfred, The Great King 871-901 ending after 25 generations with Mary Wentworth.

Both maternal and paternal lines are documented with a connection at Gen 15 with Joan Plantagenet. His documentation has been accepted by the Baronial Order of Magna Charta, the National Society of Magna Carta Dames, The Order of the Crown of Charlemagne and Americans of Royal Descent.

Children are our pathway to many mile stones in our lives, and the same holds true for our society. In 1959 the Junior Member program of our society was created at the suggestion of member Mrs. Eva Elizabeth Wright Driggs.

"During the first year over thirty Juniors we enrolled and the number steadily increased ever since. We feel that the Junior program encourages an interest on the part of young people in the Mayflower Society and provides for adult membership.

It has been our privilege to welcome as Junior Member some two hundred and fifty young people, ages one week to eighteen years in the past ten years.

Special programs have been arranged nearly every year to appeal to school age Junior. Mrs. L. Welch Pogue has been very successful with the Triennial Junior Scrap Book Competition with helps

to create an incentive for the young people to learn more about their Mayflower ancestors and Pilgrim history, as well as to make them feel that they are an important part of our Society."



WAMPANOAG RECIPES

NASAUMP

Nasaump is a traditional Wampanoag dish that is made from dried corn, local berries, and nuts. It is boiled in water until it thickens, and is similar to a porridge or oatmeal.

1 1/2 cups cornmeal
1 cup strawberries, raspberries , blueberries or a combination of all three
1/2 cup crushed walnuts, hazelnuts, sunflower seeds or a combination of all three
1 quart water
maple syrup or sugar to taste (optional)

Grandma Moses Society of Mayflower Descendants in the District of Columbia

"It should also be recorded for posterity that Mrs. Anna Mary (Robertson) Moses, known to the worlds as "Grandma Moses", was elected to membership in the District of Columbia Society at a regular meeting held on 31 October 1953 at the age of 93. Grandma Moses descended from Francis Cooke and from Archibald Robertson of the Albany Company, New York Militia, in the Revolutionary War. She was over 70 years of age when she began painting. On 9 October 1940, she opened a "one-man" exhibition entitled "What a Farm Wife Painted" at the Galerie St. Etienne on West 57th Street in New York City. This exhibition of her world was followed by one hundred and fifty-six exhibitions throughout this country, Canada and Europe. Articles about her appeared in many publications here and in over 30 publications abroad including Korea and China.

Her paintings possess a freshness of color and design together with a delightful simplicity. She received several Honorary Doctorates and many prizes including one from the Women's National Press Club presented by president Harry S. Truman in 1949. Her works hang in the most famous art galleries here and abroad. Among her many paintings were "The Rainbow", "The Quilting Bee", "Candle Dip Day", "Let me Help", "A Frosty Day", "Father's Hour", "Flying Kites," and "Gray Day.""
